Infrastructure Update

The final tender report has been sent to the Archdiocesan Planning Committee to be processed for the refurbishment of the two storey building. We have decanted the building in readiness for the program to begin. The Maintenance team now has a workshop up in the staff carpark. I will update you with any further information as soon as it becomes available. We do not yet have a firm start date.

Traffic Safety

Once again, I ask that all parents are patient and follow staff directions for the smoothest and fastest entrance and exit to and from St Mary's during the Grimshaw St closure for NEL works. We will all get into a safe routine.

In October, for four weeks Grimshaw Street closed in both directions between Greensborough Bypass and Greensborough Road from 5am, Monday 6 October to 5am, Saturday 1 November. NELP has advised the school of major interruptions to traffic and to plan accordingly. We have devised a contingency plan for entrance into the school via William St & Grimshaw Street. Attached is the **updated** map and clear directions that must be adhered to for clear traffic flow. We also request everyone to be patient and understanding as drop off and pick up may take longer than usual. I will ensure any updates provided to me in relation to road closures or access to the school are shared with you immediately so that you can plan your trips accordingly.



National Teaching Matters Summit

I was so privileged to be invited to represent MACS Principals and share my experience of Charting the Course: A Leader's Guide to Navigating Change with Glenn Fahey (Director of the Centre for Independent Studies) moderating our conversation with Michael Roberts (Managing Director Mastery Schools Australia), Kerrie Flynn (Principal St Peter Chanel, Smithton Tasmania), and Anna Masters (Principal Merici College ACT).
